

Kingsburg Joint Union High School District Post-Secondary Planning

Students that are planning to attend a California State University or University of California after graduating high school must satisfy the following minimum admission requirements, known as "A-G requirements".

College preparatory courses offered by KHS that satisfy CSU & UC "A-G" admission requirements	Years Required For CSU & UC Admissions
A. History/Social Science World History A, U.S. History A, Civics A, AP Government & Politics, AP U.S. History, AP World History	Two (2) years.
B. English English 1A, English 2A, English 3A, AP English 3 (lang.), English 4A, AP English 4 (lit.)	Four (4) years of college-preparatory English
C. Mathematics Algebra 1B or 1, Geometry, Honors Geometry, Algebra 2, Honors Algebra 2, Prob/Stats, Math Analysis, Honors Math Analysis, AP Calculus, AP Statistics	Three (3) years required. Four years recommended.
D. Laboratory Science Applied Ag Biology, Biology A, Honors Biology, Chemistry, Analytical Chemistry, Physics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, Anatomy & Physiology	Two (2) years required. Three years recommended. One year Life Science and one year Physical Science required.
E. Language Other Than English Spanish 1, Spanish 1-2, Spanish 2, Spanish 3, Spanish 3-4, AP Spanish Language	Two (2) years required. Three years recommended. (at least two years of the same language).
F. Visual and Performing Arts Art 1, Beginning Ceramics/Sculpture, Adv Ceramics/Sculpture 1-3, Chamber/Jazz Choir, Drama/Theatre Arts 1-2, Drawing and Painting 1-3, Jazz Band, Men's Ensemble, Percussion, AP Studio Art, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, Women's Ensemble, Advanced Women's Ensemble	One (1) year. A single year-long course.
G. College Preparatory Electives Many advanced level courses including, but not limited to: Earth Science, AP Human Geography, ROP Virtual Enterprise, Intro Computer Programming, Adv Computer Programming, Astronomy/Geology, Economics A, AVID Senior Seminar	One (1) year of academic courses in any of the above A-G areas in addition to those required.

*Students must pass each college preparatory course with a "C" or better to meet A-G requirements.

KHS Counseling Services

All students have access to academic and personal counseling services. Students may email, phone, or sign up in the office to request an appointment with a counselor at any time throughout the school year. Counselors assist students with high school entry, graduation, ***Career Technical Education (CTE)** or **College/University** enrollment by offering the following guidance activities for each grade level:

- 8th Grade Transition: Frosh Orientation Night, 8th grade visitations, on-site registration and placement testing.
- 9th Grade: Frosh Welcome Day and 4-year planning
- 10th Grade: Sophomore classroom presentation and academic review, Sophomore/Junior Parent Night
- 11th Grade: Sophomore/Junior Parent Night
- 12th Grade: Senior Information Night, College Day, Senior graduation status checks (biannually), Financial Aid Night
- The College and Career Center is available to all students throughout the year and utilized through their English classes.

Academic advising is done throughout the school year and always at registration with every student.
