




FOREWORD


FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

The members are conducting a rodent and post control program as an aide to the community.













TENNIS


The tennis team this year was entered in a different division. They played dual matches with Selma, Washington Union, Kerman. Fowler, and Central.






