As the seniors make the last curtain call, they look back over their four years in Kingsburg High School and recall the many important events which have taken place.


The opening act was given at the end of the freshman year when they presented, with the sophomores, "K. H. S. Roundup," a successful western show.


Other incidents occurring in the third act were an exchange program with Fowler, a Mother-Daughter reception and the installation of next year's officers.







The highlight of the band's activity was the Music Show held in May. Many hours were spent preparing "Music Through the Ages."











The girls were anxious for basketball season to begin so they would have the opportunity to make use of the new gym. After nine weeks of play, basketball also drew to a close.
