Solitary, abandoned by the world, lost in the vacuum of time he watches the street change scenes.


Modern things surround him like a curse,


Naomi Zakarian represented

Choral music at Kingsburg High has reached new heights in the past few years. The choirs have grown both in quantity and quality to now be considered one of the finest choral programs in the state.



The chorus is open to anyone who enjoy singing and has voice qualities which need special attention or development. The chorus perform on concerts at home and the festivals in the area.



With benefits to the students, the council continued operation of the student store, milkshake machine, and the suggestion box.










CSF and Honor Roll

Kingsburg High School is very fortunate in having the only public observatory in Fresno County.



The Kingsburg High School rocket points toward the stars.






After ten hours of work, the Candy Striper receives her name pin. A cap is given to each girl upon the completion of twenty-five hours.





Being one of the most largest organizations, the Spanish Club has also become one of the most active clubs on campus.






