

Despite a slow beginning, the Norseman ended a successful season taking second place in league play. The coach credited the fine year to the low injury rate and the great team spirit throughout the season.


The first three games played were lost by needless mistakes due to the team's inexperience. The next three games were played by a much improved team only to lose to Exeter by a score of 9-0









The Big Green Machine finished with a 14-1 dual match record, which is one of its finest records established in years.




Organizing committees were a big part of Student Council.


