Elks Most Valuable Student Competition

Deadline: November 13, 2023

The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships (range is \$1,000-\$7,500) to the highest-rated applicants in the 2024 competition. **Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks.** Male and female students compete separately. The scholarships are for students pursuing a 4 year degree on a full time basis in a U.S. college or university. They must be a US citizen and a current high school senior. Cooke College Scholarship Program

Deadline: November 16, 2023

This is a very competitive, very generous scholarship. Must be a senior planning to graduate from a U.S. high school in spring 2024 and intend to enroll in an accredited 4 year college beginning fall 2024, must have earned a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above, must demonstrate unmet financial need (they will consider applicants with gross family income up to \$95,000). <https://www.jkcf.org/our-scholarships/college-scholarship-program/>

SchoolHouse Connections

Deadline: November 24, 2023

Eligibility requirements: Applicants must have been born on or after Nov. 24, 2003 and must be entering college for the first time in 2024. You will begin college (four year, community college, or trade school) for the **First Time** in 2024 (not including dual-enrollment courses) Must have experienced homelessness within the last 6 years. Must reside in the United States (undocumented students who meet the criteria are eligible.) To be eligible for this selective scholarship a student must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, Black/African American and current high school senior, demonstrate academic achievement, exhibit leadership ability, participate in community service activities and have a demonstrated financial need.
