Plan Development



The District recognizes the importance of in-person instruction to student academic achievements and social, emotional, and physical health and well-being. This is the reason that the District brought students back to in-person instruction as soon as it was allowed to do so during the 2020-2021 school year.

Because of the District's careful planning and preparation, the district was able to return to in-person hybrid learning on October 15, 2020. For the 2022 – 2023 school year, all students will be engaged in in-person instruction. For students and families choosing not to return to in-person instruction, students may enroll in Kingsburg Independent Study.

The Safe Return to School Plan was initially developed in October 2020. This plan was developed through consistent communication and input from stakeholders. This communication continued through the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years. The Safe Return Plan has been modified to meet the new federal, state, and local health guidance. Continued stakeholder communication and input will occur during the 2022-23 school year.

Odd/Even Schedule Enhanced Safety Measures

TRADITIONAL

Part in person, part distance learning Actual schedule will be based on county public health guidelines

HYBRID

ALL ONLINE

Daily Instruction from teachers, following an odd/even schedule (available during complete school closure only)

DISTANCE LEARNING

The direction the District chooses will be based on Public Health Orders. Parents, students, and staff should understand that the District may have to move from different instructional options at any time.

Kingsburg Independent Study



- Standards-based curriculum
- Uses an online instructional platform (Edgenuity)
- Supported/delivered by Kingsburg Independent Study teachers
- Weekly synchronous instruction with teacher using distance learning platforms
- Weekly lesson schedule is paced by teacher with some flexibility
- Attendance will be taken by teacher
- Not all classes covered in traditional





Staff and Student Screening



Parents: Please review these questions before sending students to school. (Questions subject to change due to guidance from county public health)

- Are you feverish?
- o Do you have chills?
- Do you have a new or worsening cough?
- O Do you have shortness of breath?
- ** If answer to any question is yes, stay home. **





Student and Campus Safety

What happens when a student becomes sick?

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Persons Who Test Positive for COVID-19 (Student A)	Recommended Action
Everyone, regardless of vaccination status, previous infection or lack of symptoms.	 Stay home for at least 5 days. Isolation can end after day 5 if symptoms are not present or are resolving and a diagnostic specimen collected on day 5 or later tests negative. If fever is present, isolation must be continued until fever resolves for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications. If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after day 10. Wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings. * Antigen test preferred.







Student and Campus Safety

What happens when a student becomes sick?



Student B	Recommended Action
Any student who is solely symptomatic or who has tested for COVID-19 due to symptoms and waiting for lab results	With symptoms: Isolation until the following requirements have been met: • 24 hours* (1 day) with no fever (without the use of fever-reducing medicine) and • Symptoms have improved







Student and Campus Safety

What happens when a student becomes sick?



Student C	Recommended Action
Any student who believes they have been a close contact with a COVID-19 positive person at home, school, or in the community	 is or becomes symptomatic, regardless of vaccination status, refer to Student B. Is asymptomatic, regardless of vaccination status, Student may return to school. *Testing is recommended. If Student C receives a negative test result, they may return to school. If Student C receives a positive test result, see Student A.







Prevention Tips



- Wash hands with soap and water or alcohol-based sanitizer before starting work and frequently throughout the day.
- Do not share food or drinks.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Sanitize work area before leaving each day.
- Practice good respiratory etiquette (cover cough and sneezes with a tissue or into sleeve).

If your child becomes ill

- Please contact your physician
- If you are unsure if your child has COVID, please test. If your child is negative, your child can return to school when they have no symptoms for 24 hours.
- Inform your site administrator, coach or advisory that your child is home sick.







Face Coverings



All students in high school must use face coverings in accordance with California Department of Public Health (CDPH) guidelines. <u>Face coverings</u> are not required at this time.

Mask Requirement



- In order to comply with this guidance, schools must exclude students from campus if they are not exempt from wearing a face covering under CDHP guidelines and refuse to wear one at school while indoors. A student who inadvertently fails to bring a face covering to school or for bus transportation, one will be provided.
- Face coverings will be required in every indoor common area.
- Masks and neck buffs (gaiters) are acceptable. Shields are acceptable with a neck shirt. Bandanas will not be allowed.





How to Wear a Face Covering Correctly

- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- o Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face



Use a Face Mask to Protect Others

 Wear a face covering that covers your nose and mouth to help protect others in case you're infected with COVID-19 but don't have symptoms.







Campus Safety





At all KJUHSD Sites:

- High-touch surfaces in all common areas will be disinfected daily.
- Classrooms- student desks, chairs and teacher area disinfected daily.
- New ionization ventilation in all classes and office space
- Buses- Cleaned and disinfected daily and after transporting any individual who exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.
 Drivers will be provided disinfectant wipes.





Personal Protective Equipment

- 1. Disposable masks available.
- 2. Each classroom will have hand sanitizer and disposable cleaning wipes.
- 3. Each classroom will be cleaned and sanitized daily.
- 4. Bathrooms will be cleaned daily.
- 5. All students with symptoms will be sent home.
- 6. Mitigation of sick students/staff will follow the FCHD COVID guidelines.
- 7. Hand sanitizing stations will be placed in key locations around the campus.





Handling an Illness on Campus



Steps for Illness on KHS Campus

If a staff member or administrator feels the student is ill, or if the student identifies themselves as being ill, the following steps will be taken:

- Student will be excused from class and instructed to head to the office
- 2. Facial coverings must be worn at all times once the student is identified as potentially ill
- 3. Student will knock on Mrs. Lund's window and Mrs. Lund will asses the situation
- 4. Weather permitting, and whenever possible, it is preferred that the student wait outside for pick-up

Steps for Illness on Oasis Campus

- Parents and students will be advised to not come to campus if they are feeling sick or showing symptoms
- If a student says they are sick on campus, they will be isolated as soon as possible from the rest of the student body. Parent/Guardian will be called to pick the student up or give permission to walk home
- If a student is sick in the classroom, the teacher will give the student a "red card" and they will go to the window outside of Ms. Avila's desk and knock on the window. The student will show office staff the "red card". Phone call will immediately be placed home regarding sick student and they will be picked up or leave campus immediately with parent/guardian permission. They will wait outside until they are picked up.







Transportation Expectation and Guidelines



The safety of our employees and our students is top priority, and due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there are new expectations and guidelines we will be requiring all of our staff and students who board a school bus to follow in order to keep everyone safe. These guidelines were developed with careful coordination with the Fresno County Department of Public Health as well as accordance with the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and the Department of Education (CDE).

- For students needing to use the districts bus services, reducing risk for students and drivers will require:
 - Disinfecting bus surfaces and seats daily
 - Windows on buses will be open, weather permitting, to maximize air flow
 - Bus filled from back to front or as needed by bus stop location
 - Should a student become ill while in transit, they will be isolated in a dedicated seat.
- We need everyone's cooperation to remain safe during this COVID-19 pandemic.






School Meals

Meal Delivery and Location

No-cost meals will be available for all students who are students of the district. Meals will be served at the snack bar.



Snack Bar Practices

Cafeteria cleaning procedures will follow the enhanced cleaning protocols outlined in the Students, Staff and Campus Safety section. In addition, if/when students eat on campus, surfaces will be cleaned before and after each lunch period. Hand sanitizer will be available to students before and after lunch, and time will be built into the school day for hand washing and sanitizing. Food service staff will wear required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and will maintain social distancing during food distribution.







No-Cost Meals

The State of California recently extended no-cost meals through June 30, 2023 to all children, it is important that families who are eligible still apply as this will affect future funding for students. Applications can be accessed through the <u>Aeries Parent Portal</u> during the data confirmation process or by contacting your school office.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. Can students still bring their own meals to school?
 - Yes, students still have the option of bringing their own meals to school.





Students with Special Needs

Health & Safety Precautions

- School personnel will work closely with families of students who are immunocompromised regarding specific needs when returning to school.
- Staff will be provided with face coverings which are most conducive to addressing specific student needs.
- Services will be delivered with adherence to the wearing of facial coverings, and increased hand washing and sanitizing.
- Daily health screenings will be conducted by staff.

Options for Learning

Kingsburg JUHSD is returning all Special Education students to traditional, in-person instruction. All health and safety considerations and protocols that are given by local and state public health officials for general education will also apply to special education. If a student cannot attend in-person for medical reasons, our pre-COVID practices of addressing student needs through the IEP process will continue.
