

Advanced Placement Tests

Cost is \$89.00 per test: Oct. letter

Payable in two installments, first payment due by November 1, final payment due by March 29.

College Application Fees

Each college or university application fee is approximately \$50 - \$90 per application. No cost for community college applications.







KHS Graduation Requirements

MINIMUM GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: 230 Credits Total

CREDITS TO INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING: 4 years (40 credits) in English 3 years (30 credits) in Math (must pass 10 credits Math 1 or Math 1B) 1 year (10 credits) in Physical Science 1 year (10 credits) in Life Science 1 year (10 credits) in Health/Wellness 1 year (10 credits) in World History 1 year (10 credits) in U.S. History 1 semester (5 credits) in Civics 1 semester (5 credits) in Economics 1 year (10 credits) in Visual /Performing Arts 2 years (20 credits) in P.E. (unless excused by doctor for medical reason)

The remaining 70 credits or 7 classes may be chosen in any area.

Post-secondary Planning



4-year university Community College CTE/Vocational Military





University (CSU/UC) **Minimum** Entrance Requirements 15 college-preparatory (A-G) courses

- 4 years English
- 3 years Math: Math 1A + Math 1B or Math 1, Math 2, Math 3 (4 years recommended)
- 2 years History/Social Science
- 2 years Science (3 years recommended)
- 2 years Foreign Language (3 years recommended)
- 1 year Visual/Performing Arts
- 1 year College Prep Elective (math, science, foreign language, etc.)

Other requirements: "C" grade or higher in all coursework



- 23 campuses in California
- Online application due Oct. 1- Nov. 30 https://www2.calstate.edu/apply/freshman
- No essay, no letters of recommendation
- SAT and/or ACT will not be used in admissions decisions: <u>CSU Testing Requirements</u>
- Some selection criteria: A-G completion, academic rigor, GPA in A-Gs and math/science
- Application fee \$70
- Tuition \$6,084 (additional fees vary by campus) <u>CSU Tuition</u>







University of California (Public)

10 campuses in California (9 Undergraduate)



- Online application due Oct. 1- Nov. 30 https://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply-now.html
- No letters of recommendation
- Personal Insight Questions (PIQs) required: 4
- SAT and/or ACT scores will not be used in admissions decisions.
- Application fee \$80
- Tuition and fees \$16,326 UC Tuition and Fees





University of California-"Comprehensive Review"

Some factors that are considered in applicant review:

- → A-G completion and GPA in A-G coursework
- → Rigor of coursework
- → Quality of senior year program
- → Marked improvement in academic performance
- → Special talents, achievements, leadership and significant contributions
- → Accomplishments made with special circumstances
- Geographic location of school







Independent Colleges (Private)



- Revolving application deadlines
- Varying application requirements
- Letters of recommendation
- Essays
- Counselor reports, recommendation
- Tuition and school fees vary widely

- 116 statewide
- State Center- 5 locations- Fresno City, Reedley, Clovis Community https://www.scccd.edu/
 - College of the Sequoias (COS), West Hills
 - General Education (GE), Career Tech (CTE) Programs
 - No application fee, no essay, no letters of rec, no admission tests
 - Online application/5 matriculation steps
 - AB 19 varies by community college campus.



- FAFSA Free Application for Federal Student Aid (or Dream Act application)
- File between December and March 2
- Pell Grant and Cal Grant, Middle Class Scholarship
- California Community Colleges tuition waiver
- Work Study Federal Loans
- GPA verification completed by KHS
- Financial Aid workshop (see next slide)

If a student/parent decides not to submit a financial aid application, they must submit a signed waiver to KHS.




