The student body rarely sees these trustees "en masse", but they know that the individual members of the Board continually bear the weight of the responsibility to the school. It is through their guidance and counsel that Kingsburg High has moved forward with rapid progress.

Giving of their time freely, they have helped us in many ways to prepare us for life. For their services they receive no compensation, and we welcome this opportunity to express our sincere appreciation for the time and effort they have expended in the interest of our school.

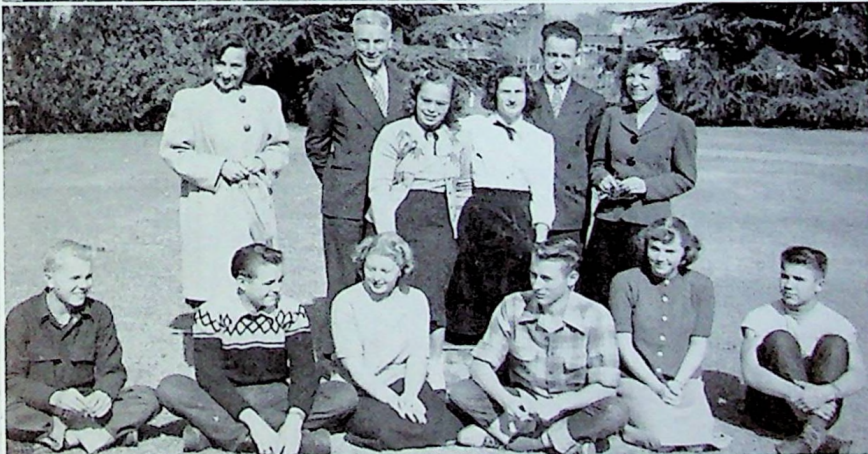

A new ruling was put into effect this year which

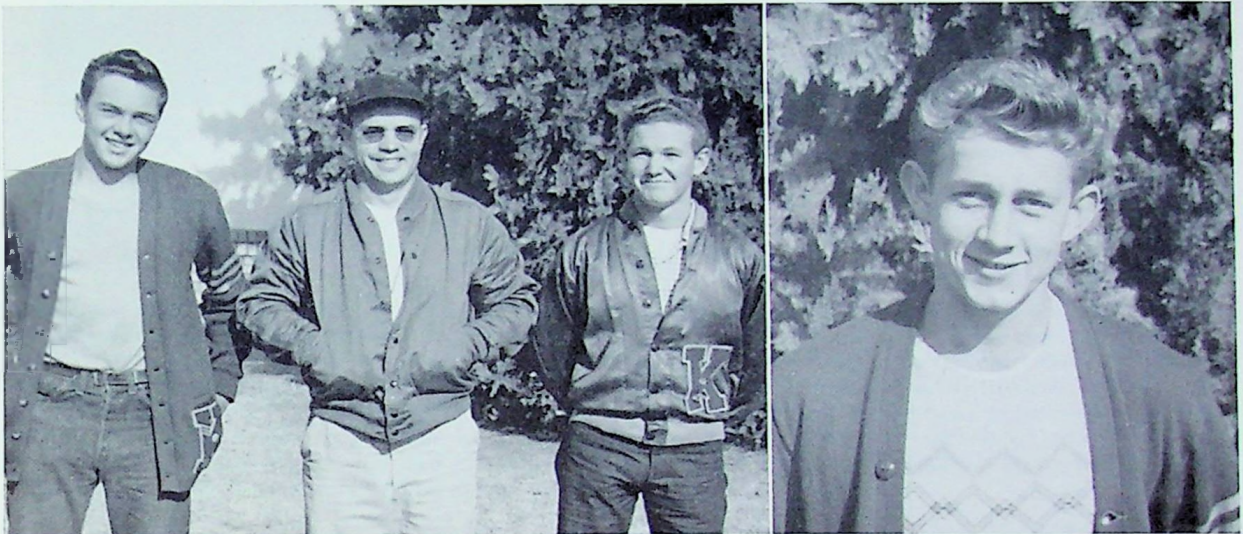
states that no girl nor any member of the B Class is allowed to wear a varsity sweater or letter.

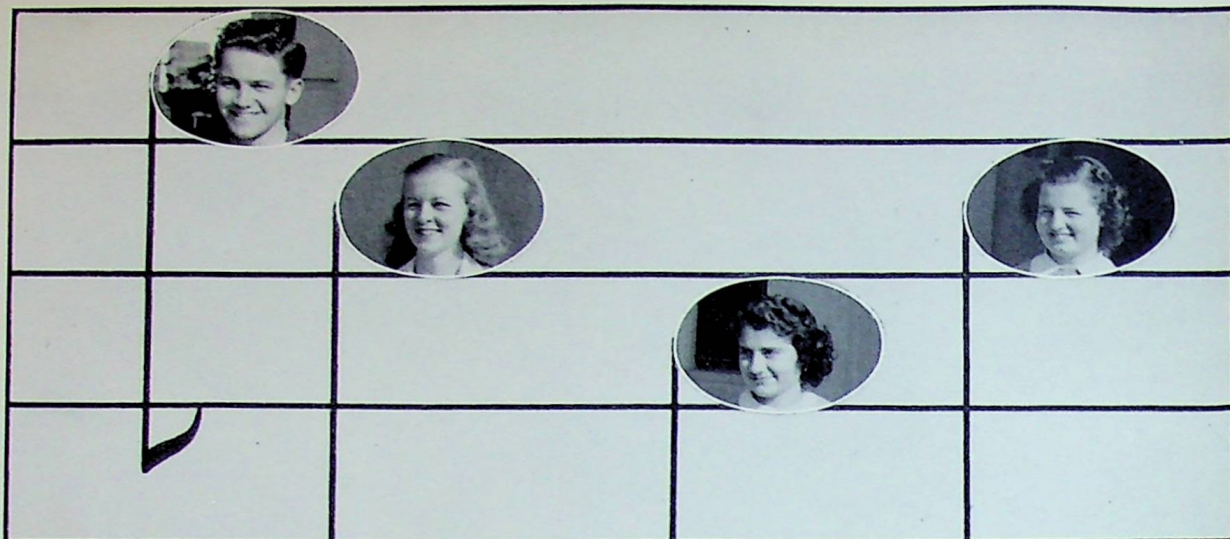

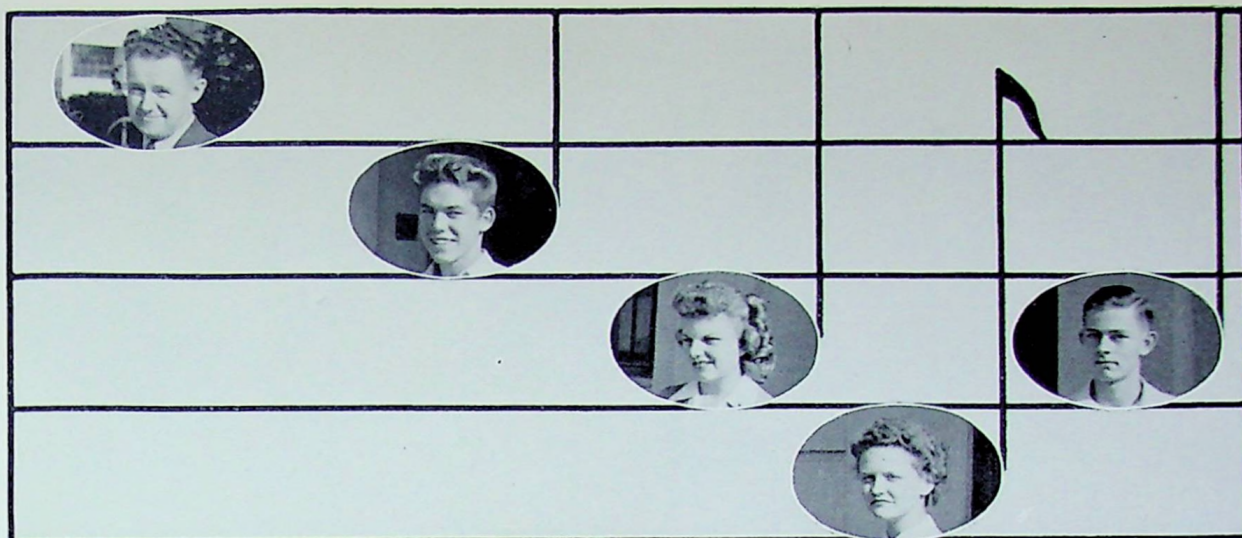
Although examination day blues came occasionally, most of the time was spent in playing for pure enjoyment. Members of the group developed a true appre-

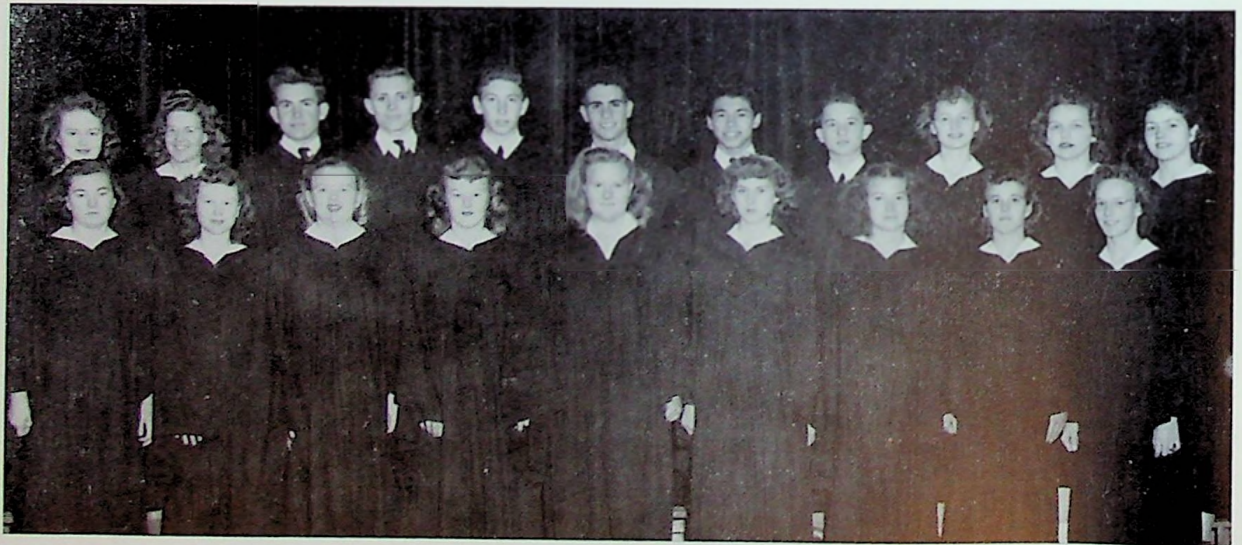
Under the capable leadership of Mr. Stephens, the chorus has progressed this year by leaps and bounds. The group was continually striving to improve.

The men of the winged feet, otherwise known as the Viking track team, finished a successful season after entering in eight meets and competing with nearly all the schools in the San Joaquin Valley.

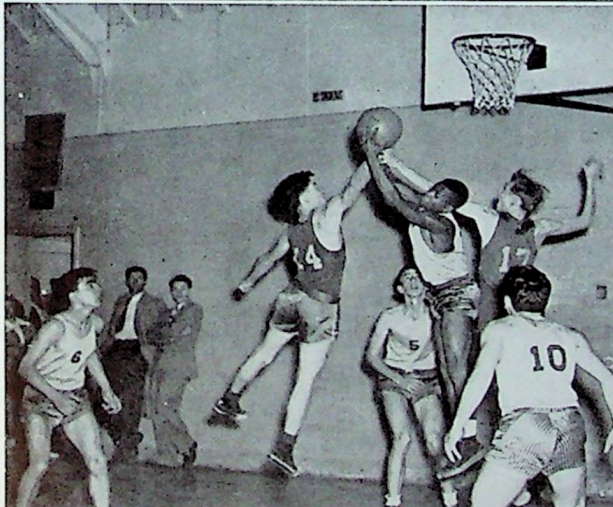
Prospects were good with 15 returning lettermen in the three classes. Since there was a large turnout this year, things should also go well for the 1948 "A," "B," and "C" track squads.
