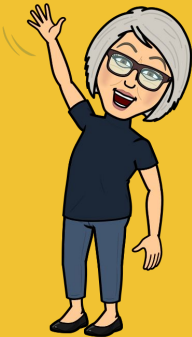

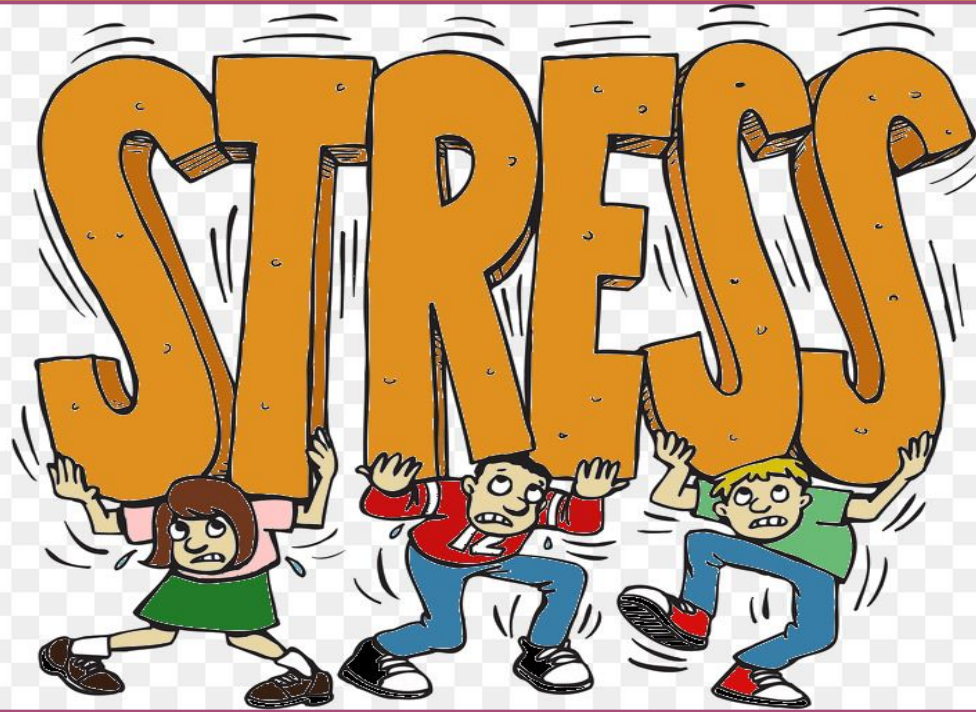

## Advanced Placement Tests

## College Application Fees

Each college or university application fee is approximately \$50 - \$90 per application. No cost for community college applications.



# KHS Graduation Requirements

MINIMUM GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: 230 Credits Total

## CREDITS TO INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- 4 years (40 credits) in English
- 3 years (30 credits) in Math (must pass 10 credits Math 1 or Math 1B)
- 1 year (10 credits) in Physical Science
- 1 year (10 credits) in Life Science
- 1 year (10 credits) in Health/Wellness
- 1 year (10 credits) in World History
- 1 year (10 credits) in U.S. History
- 1 semester (5 credits) in Civics
- 1 semester (5 credits) in Economics
- 1 year (10 credits) in Visual /Performing Arts
- 2 years (20 credits) in P.E. (unless excused by doctor for medical reason)

\*\*The remaining 70 credits or 7 classes may be chosen in any area.\*\*

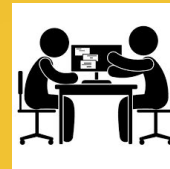

# University (CSU/UC) Minimum Entrance Requirements

## 15 college-preparatory (A-G) courses

- 4 years English
- 3 years Math: Math 1A + Math 1B **or** Math 1, Math 2, Math 3  
(4 years recommended)
- 2 years History/Social Science
- 2 years Science (3 years recommended)
- 2 years Foreign Language (3 years recommended)
- 1 year Visual/Performing Arts
- 1 year College Prep Elective (math, science, foreign language, etc.)

*Other requirements: "C" grade or higher in all coursework*

## California State Universities (Public)



- 23 campuses in California
- Online application due **Oct. 1- Nov. 30** <https://www2.calstate.edu/apply/freshman>
- No essay, no letters of recommendation
- SAT and/or ACT will not be used in admissions decisions: [CSU Testing Requirements](#)
- **Some selection criteria:** A-G completion, academic rigor, GPA in **A-Gs** and math/science
- Application fee - \$70
- Tuition - \$6,084 (additional fees vary by campus) [CSU Tuition](#)





## University of California (Public)

- 10 campuses in California (9 Undergraduate)
- Online application due **Oct. 1- Nov. 30** <https://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply-now.html>
- No letters of recommendation
- Personal Insight Questions (PIQs) required: **4**
- SAT and/or ACT scores will not be used in admissions decisions.
- Application fee - \$80
- Tuition and fees - \$16,326 [UC Tuition and Fees](#)



## University of California-“Comprehensive Review”

Some factors that are considered in applicant review:

- A-G completion and GPA in A-G coursework
- Rigor of coursework
- Quality of senior year program
- Marked improvement in academic performance
- Special talents, achievements, leadership and significant contributions
- Accomplishments made with special circumstances
- Geographic location of school

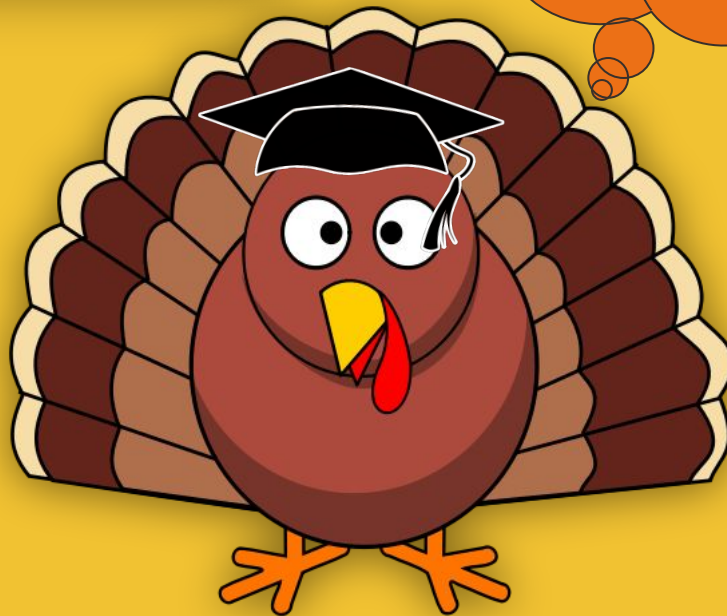

- Online application/5 matriculation steps
- AB 19 - varies by community college campus.

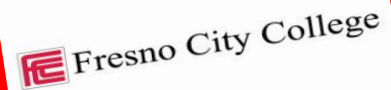

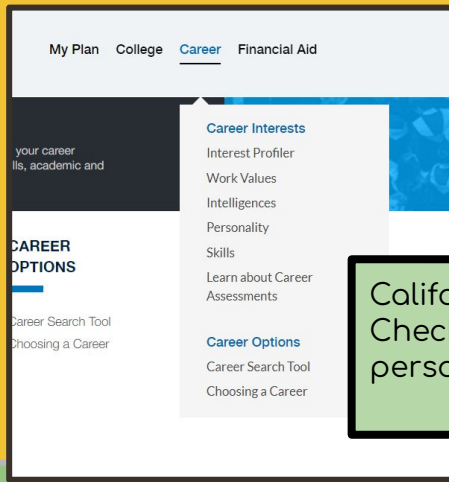

If a student/parent decides not to submit a financial aid application, they must submit a signed waiver to KHS.



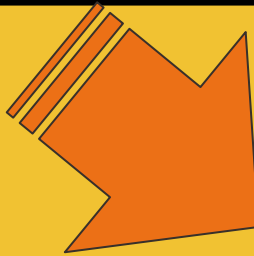

If you do not file a financial aid application for your student, a new law requires that parents submit an Opt-Out Waiver to KHS.. There is a copy in the back of the Senior Info Book or you can pick one up at the KHS office.. Please complete AND sign the form and then return to the KHS Counseling Office by March 1, 2024.

**Kingsburg Joint Union High School District  
FAFSA or CADAA Opt-Out Form**

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) determines a pupil's eligibility for financial aid to assist with a pupil's attendance at a college or career school. California Education Code (CEC) § 51225.7 requires a local educational agency to confirm each 12th grade pupil's completion and submission of a FAFSA or CADAA unless the pupil is determined to be exempt or an opt-out form is completed by a pupil who is a legally emancipated minor, a pupil who is 18 years or older, a legal guardian, or parent, or a local educational agency on a pupil's behalf.

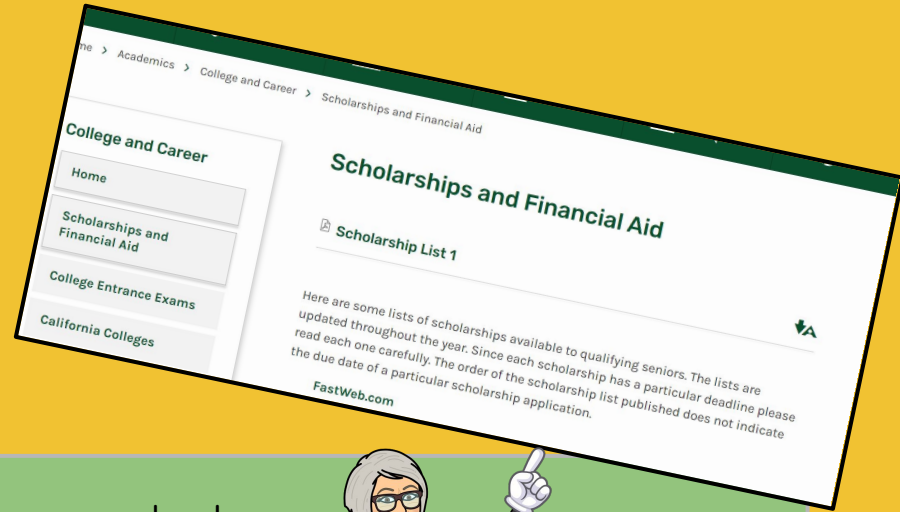
This opt-out form permits a pupil to **opt out** of the completion of a FAFSA or CADAA form. To opt a pupil out of the Financial Aid Application requirement, please complete this form and return it to your local high school office **by February 1, 2024, or can be emailed as a PDF to Cindy Schreiner, Executive Director of Student Services, cschreiner@kingsburghigh.com.**

Submitting a Financial Aid Application Opt-Out Form does not prohibit a pupil from completing and submitting a financial aid application at any time in the future.

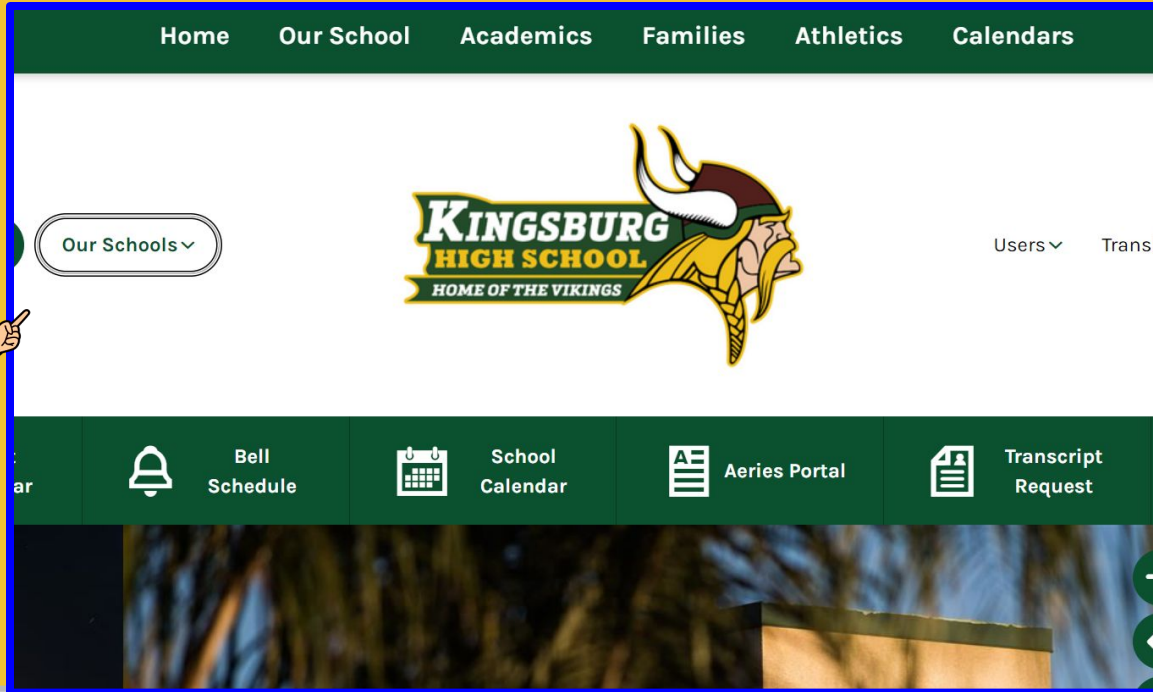
